

Kingdom, Church, Body THE GREEK WORD IS "EKKLESIA"...



This word is a combination of two words: ek (out of) and kaleo (to call)

Ekklesia is translated Church 100 times either singular or plural

Ekklesia is translated Congregation 2 times depending on version (Acts 7:38)

Ekklesia is translated Assembly in a political sense 3 times. (Acts 19:32)

Kingdom, **Church**, Body

- . Thayer's definition offers the following uses of
- "ekklesia" in the Bible:

- f
- "an assembly of Christians gathered for worship in a religious meeting" - cf. 1Co 14:19,35
- "a company of Christians, or of those who, hoping for eternal salvation through Jesus Christ, observe their own religious rites, hold their own religious meetings, and manage their own affairs, according to regulations prescribed for the body for order's sake"
 cf. 1Th 1:1
- "those who anywhere, in a city, village, constitute such a company and are united into one body" - cf. 1Co 1:2
- "the whole body of Christians scattered throughout the earth" cf. Ep 1:22-23
- "the assembly of faithful Christians already dead and received into heaven" - cf. He 12:22-23

Kingdom, Church, Body

Putting it most simply, we can think of the church

in two primary senses:


- The church universal the whole assembly of people who are saved, both living and dead
- The church local a company of saved people in a geographical area who work and worship together as a local congregation

1Pt 2:9: We are Called out

2Th 2:14: We are called out by the gospel

Acts 2:38-47: We are added to the church when we respond to the call.

Kingdom, Church, Body



- Eph 1:18-23
- This metaphor depicts the relationship we enjoy with Christ and each other
 - Christ is our Head, from which we as the body receive nourishment Col 2:19
 - We are members of the body, and of one another 1Co 12:27; Ro 12:5



Other designations:

- Household
 - The family of God 1Ti 3:15
 - This emphasizes the familial relationship we
 enjoy in Christ
 - We are in Jesus' "family" Mt 12:48-50
 - We have many brothers and sisters Mk 10:28-30
 - We are to treat each other accordingly 1Ti 5:1-2
- Flock
 - 1Pt 5;1
- Temple
 - Eph 2:19-22
- . Bride
 - 2Cor 11:2
